1. Briefly describe your organization's history, mission and goals.

History: Formed in 1875, Pinal County Sheriff's Office (PCSO) is the 3rd largest sheriff's office in Arizona. Pinal County Sheriff's Office provides patrol services, criminal investigations, search & rescue, and operates the County Detention Center. There are approximately 500 employees with nearly 230 patrol Deputies sworn. The Pinal County Sheriff's Office also overlaps Districts 1-4 of the Gila River Indian Community.

Mission: To Preserve the Peace, Protect Life and Property, and promote Public Safety while upholding the Constitution. **Goals:** To proudly serve Pinal County's diverse community with enthusiasm.

3. Describe the proposed project, objectives, and your plan to implement.

This project is for the purchase of a 2024 multi-use trailer. This trailer is fully enclosed measuring 28 feet length to be used by the Pinal County Sheriff's Office Traffic Unit for motorcycle transportation, CMV Enforcement, and VCU Investigations.

The Pinal County Sheriff's Office Traffic Unit is the founding agency of the Pinal County Regional Vehicle Crimes Task Force, a mixture of agencies throughout Pinal County to include the Queen Creek Police Department whose borders extend into Maricopa County. With the forming of this Regional Task Force the Pinal County Sheriff's Office Traffic Unit has exponentially increased its investigative case load. The area of responsibility of this Task Force overlaps with several portions of the Gila River Indian Community.



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The objective is to implement this trailer in several roles throughout Pinal County. This trailer will be used as a stationary command post during vehicle crimes investigations and commercial vehicle enforcement. There has been a steady increase in major collisions involving commercial vehicles in Pinal County. Enforcement ensures that commercial vehicles used throughout the county are safe for citizens of Pinal County on and adjacent to the roadway should be safe from issues caused by commercial vehicles and these persons depend on the Pinal County Sheriff's Office to inspect these vehicles and remove the unsafe vehicles from posing a continued hazard. Commercial Vehicle inspection equipment would be stored and transported in this trailer to be used on the highways of Pinal County to insure that the commercial vehicles are safe to operate.

The Pinal County Vehicle Crimes Task Force responds to every corner of the county to conduct investigations and to assist agencies in the county with these major collision investigations. These investigations often happen in inclement weather and having an enclosed area to work in would be beneficial to citizens all over Pinal County. Items such as collision scanners (FARO), drones, scales, awnings, chairs, and other devices used during these in-depth collision investigations would be transported in this trailer to collision scenes to be used during investigations.

The trailer is also specifically designed to transport up to six police motorcycles. Multiple agencies in Pinal County use motorcycles for routine traffic enforcement as well as additional duties including community events, trainings, escorts and repairs.

4. Describe how the proposed project satisfies one or more of the priority funding areas identified by the Gila River Indian Community.

The Pinal County Sheriff's Office Traffic Unit is comprised of 8 Deputies, 2 Sergeants, and 1 Lieutenant. The goal of the Pinal County Sheriff's Office Traffic Unit is to promote public safety of the roadways in Pinal County through enforcement, engineering, and education. Deputies in the Traffic Unit go through extensive specialty training in order to conduct full and thorough traffic related investigations. Traffic Deputies specialize in speed enforcement, DUI enforcement, commercial vehicle enforcement and inspections, investigating vehicular fatalities, phlebotomy, homicide investigations, and enforcement on law enforcement motorcycles. This project will enhance the abilities of the Pinal County Sheriff's Office Traffic Unit to transport the necessary equipment to conduct active and sustained enforcement on the roadways. The active



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enforcement of traffic laws addresses moving violations, enhances DUI arrests, increases the identification of commercial vehicle violations and decreases complaints of speed and aggressive driving.

Commercial Vehicle Enforcement requires several items of equipment that are specific to this specialized type of enforcement. This trailer used for Commercial Vehicle Enforcement would allow Deputies to bring necessary equipment to Commercial Vehicle Enforcement details as well as allow use on fatal and serious collision scenes. There are several occasions during the year where the Traffic Unit needs to tow several motorcycles to events and training and a trailer would allow for that.

The Pinal County Sheriff's Office Traffic Unit's current trailer is a 1999 enclosed 20 foot trailer that was seized several years prior as a recovered stolen vehicle. It is in poor condition mechanically and cosmetically. The trailer is not sealed and sustains water leaks. The current repairs needed to bring this trailer back to serviceability outweighs its value.

5. Identify the needs/problems to be addressed, target population and number of people to be served by the project.

As of 2020, the population of Pinal County is 425,264 people. Pinal County is home to one of the biggest bedroom communities in the State of Arizona, San Tan Valley. San Tan Valley alone has an extremely high volume of daily commuter traffic. 14.9 % of drivers in San Tan Valley have been cited for aggressive driving; that's 50% more aggressive than the state average. As of January 2020 through 2023, Pinal County Communications center has received the following number of reported incidents:

4,541 - Non-Injury Collision

1,210 – Collisions with injuries

641 – Collisions involving property damage

963 - Hit-and-run collisions

93 – Fatal Collisions.

6. Define the project as a new or continuing program. Has GRIC previously funded this project?

This project is a continuing program for the Pinal County Sheriff's Office Traffic Unit. The Pinal County Sheriff's Office Traffic Unit currently has a 1999 enclosed 20 foot trailer, but the current trailer in possession is several years old with significant damage, and maintenance needs. The Gila River Indian Community has



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not previously funded this project and it was denied during the 2023 GRIC Grant Cycle.

7. Provide a brief timeline including start and finish dates. Indicate if the timeline is flexible.

If awarded in October 2024, Pinal County Sheriff's Office would need approximately 3-4 weeks to have the grant approved by the Pinal County Board of Supervisors before making the purchase of the trailer. With the current economy supply and demand, procurement of the equipment would occur within the first quarter of 2025 so long as there are no supply issues. The Pinal County Sheriff's Office Traffic Unit could start utilizing the equipment immediately upon receipt as there is no additional training required for the requested equipment.

8. Identify other organizations, partners or funders participating in the project and their roles.

There are no other partners or funders currently participating in this project. The Gila River Indian Community would be the sole and only funder of this project.

9. Would you be able to implement the proposed plan if your organization received partial funding for this project?

No, we would not be able to implement the proposed plan with partial funding. The trailer is not included in the fiscal budget for patrol support / traffic unit.

10. Describe your plan for project financial sustainability beyond the grant period. If this is a program/project previously funded by the Gila River Indian Community describe efforts made towards the previously described sustainability plan.

The Pinal County Sheriff's Office will continue to maintain the grant provided equipment to include, but not limited to: preventative maintenance, repairs, additional equipment needed, etc. The trailer manufacturer will uphold a workmanship warranty of 5 years.

11. Describe your plan to document progress and results.

The Pinal County Sheriff's Office utilizes Motorola Flex Computer Automated dispatch system to accurately document Pinal County calls for services. With this system, we are able to separate statistical information



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related to traffic collisions, and traffic enforcement. A statistics report is turned in to the traffic supervisors bi- weekly to document traffic enforcement and vehicular crime statistics.

1. 2024 Canyon Flat Top Enclosed 28 foot trailer will be used to transport needed equipment to all parts of Pinal County for Commercial Vehicle Enforcement, Vehicle Crimes Investigations, Motorcycle transport, and transport equipment to different public events. The total for the 2024 Haulmark Enclosed 28 foot trailer is \$23,803***. This quote was derived from JacksSons Trailers of Mesa.

2. 2024 Canyon Trailer Sales Tax- This is the sales tax as required by state law to be collected from sales. Sales tax is estimated at \$1750.47
