Narrative

1. Briefly describe your organization's history, mission and goals.

For the past 30 years, Regional Fire has served as the primary emergency services provider for unincorporated areas of Central and Western Pinal County, Arizona. We are not taxpayer-funded, but a non-profit organization that is supported by a minority of Commercial and Residential Subscribers who pre-pay an annual fire subscription fee for service from our fire department. Our support level from these residents have consistently been very low and insufficient concerning our financial needs, at a Subscription support rate of 20%.

We are not funded by any local taxes, endowments or donations whatsoever. We have no central identity (within a City or Town) because we are not identified to any particular community. We serve unincorporated areas surrounding the City of Casa Grande, South of Coolidge and North of Floy that have several community enclaves which includes, three RV Parks and single-family site built housing amongst open desert stretches that encompass local farms, solar farms, a power plant and farm fields or open desert areas dotted with residential or commercial enclaves. Our population base is 8,500 to 10,000 due to the upswell of winter visitors who reside in the local RV Parks which add to our resident population from October to May each year. Our call volume in 2022 was 517 calls. In 2023 our call volume increased to 795 calls. Our call volume in 2024 has decreased slightly with a total of 662 calls for service. This call volume from one station is increasing the workload of our emergency apparatus. Thus increasing mileage, the need for mechanical repairs and increased fuel costs into our additional and unfunded overhead costs.

We employ an Administrator, the Fire Chief, two Shift Leaders and two Firefighters (full-time). 15 of our Reserve Firefighters assist these shift leaders with coverage as a Second and occasionally Third (scheduled) Firefighter on shift. Our Reserves work from 2 to as many as 5 shifts per month in a part-time capacity. They are compensated by Shift Stipends which range from \$100 to \$320 per 24 hour shift depending upon qualifications and certification levels (Firefighter-2 Certifications, EMT or Paramedic) plus hourly pay-per-call.

Since 2012, Regional Fire gained recognition from the Pinal County Board of Supervisors (BOS) when they transitioned from a 3-person to the 5-person Board. They recognized and acknowledged our need for financial support through Grants and have continued their unwaivering support. They have seen first-hand the improvements that have been made in direct success of the support received, by two members of the Board of Supervisors (specifically District #3 BOS Stephen Miller and District #4 Chairman Jeffrey McClure). They have visited the station to view the improvements that the Gila River Indian Community has made possible. Although Pinal County Government has no responsibility to provide unincorporated areas with fire protection services, they have recognized the need to support Regional Fire & Rescue Department, who is the only alternative for service to their constituents in this area. We have proven our value in the communities we serve, through appropriate management of our responsibility in the administration of previous grants and our diligence in serving the unincorporated communities and the motoring public. From an accreditation standpoint, Regional Fire has recently received a re-grading of our ISO protection class and went from a Class 5 ISO to a Class-4 ISO Rating. Casa Grande is a Class-3, Phoenix, LA, San Francisco and most major cities are Class-1 fire departments, as an example.

3. Describe the proposed project, objectives, and your plan to implement.

Our highest priority and targeted goal in this opportunity is to fund the urgently needed replacement of 2 out of three cardiac monitor-defibrillator units. The Lifepak-12 is only a "3 lead" capable device and currently 24 years old as it was manufactured in 2001. Parts are no longer available for repairs. A Philips MRX unit is now 20 years old, manufactured in April 2005. Supplies are hard to find and the 12-lead cable is broken with a new cable costing an estimated \$800.00 for a unit that cannot be repaired as no other parts are available should it break down internally. A Zoll E Series Monitor-Defibrillator manufactured in 2012 which has 12 lead capability but also, cannot be repaired if it suffers a fault, is our only functioning unit available, and is 13



years old. Supplies are very limited and this machine is obsolete with no repair parts available. They have been purchased or acquired through surplus over the past 5-6 years. No one in the area utilizes Zoll or Philips and can not restock supplies from transporting agencies.

We are requesting funding to replace at least two of these machines for primary use. These new replacement machines we are requesting funding for are vital for meeting the national Standard of Care when providing Advanced Cardiac Life Support. They both come with cases, supplies, primary and spare batteries and a station battery charger. If any component suffers a hard failure in any of the three machines we have, they would be useless as they cannot be repaired.

4. Describe how the proposed project satisfies one or more of the priority funding areas identified by the Gila River Indian Community.

Priority: "Health Care & Public Safety" Regional Fire & Rescue Department is a grass-roots organization that began with very little to speak of 30 years ago. We began with this double wide manufactured home and a 40' x 60' open sided shade canopy with gravel floor from 1995 to 2017 when our second GRIC grant afforded us the opportunity to construct an enclosed fire apparatus bay building.

Under the "Healthcare" funding priority, RFRD provides Fire Based EMS to our communities with Certified EMTs and Paramedics with direct patient care while assisting in improving the overall health of our residents in our local communities. Funding to Public Safety affords many things to name a few: Fire apparatus, training, equipment and continued maintenance of our facilities and equipment. This funding strengthens a communities first responders and will provide funding to replace obsolete EMS equipment and continue to maintain our facility and the fire apparatus (fleet). The support we receive increases our response readiness and ensures the community that a well-equipped firefighting force is being adequately managed, maintained and supported. We hope the Gila River Indian Community will support us on this request in the continued care of our facilities and to continue the momentum in protecting the unincorporated communities!

5. Identify the needs/problems to be addressed, the target population and number of people to be served by the project.

Regional Fire & Rescue serves the unincorporated areas of Central Pinal County and provides the public service fire suppression and rescue services to over 8,500 residents (and small businesses) in the unincorporated areas of the county. During the winter months, that number can swell to as many as 10,000 with the population of three of the area RV Parks outside of Casa Grande city limits. We serve all residents

and motorists regardless of Subscription status and receive no taxpayer funding or endowments in support of our operations. We began applying to the tribal communities for grant assistance in 2014 in hopes of obtaining funding for facility improvements, replacement of fire apparatus and to meet our equipment needs. The Gila River Indian Community excels in this effort as proven by five previous grants since 2014. We are a non-profit, public charitable organization which is cooperating in this request with local government (Pinal County) in this application as a Grant-in-aid/Fiscal Agent, required for eligibility.

6. Define the project as a new or continuing program. Has GRIC previously funded this project?

As mentioned above, GRIC has supported Regional Fire & Rescue Department and our ongoing improvements, maintenance, equipment purchases, vehicle replacements and repairs that have been ongoing since these grants have been received in 2014, 2016, 2018, 2022 & 2024. We have continued the maintenance and improvements to the new Fire Apparatus Bay Building provided by GRIC in FY-2018 & 2022. We wish to continue the improvements and maintenance on existing projects as noted in our Grant from FY 2024 that included fire equipment, replacement SCBAs, roof repairs and vehicle maintenance. Additional funding is needed to continue the support for maintenance and care of our facilities and ongoing expenses in support of fire apparatus (vehicle) maintenance, repairs, annual pump testing and facilities maintenance and repair projects.

7. Provide a brief timeline including start and finish dates. Indicate if the timeline is flexible.

The timeline is within your fiscal year, from time of award (approx.) October 1, 2025 to September 30, 2026. New Lifepack-15 monitor defibrillators will be purchased upon award. Ongoing projects and funding toward vehicle and facility maintenance, repairs and improvements will continue until all funds have been exhausted. We greatly appreciate the assistance the Gila River Indian Community has provided us thus far and we are eager for the opportunity to host a visit to be able reveal to you, the improvements we have made since your last visit on July 27th 2018.

8. Identify other organizations, partners or funders participating in the project and their roles.

Pinal County Government is a partner in the approval as our "pass-thru organization" in this request. Other partners include the motoring public, our fire protection Subscribers and residents of the unincorporated county in those areas that receive our services.



9. Would you be able to implement the proposed plan if your organization received partial funding for this project?

We would accept partial funding to meet our highest prioritized needs. Our highest priority (item #1) is the replacement of these Cardiac Monitor-Defibrillators. However we have prioritized our needs in the Budget Details Section of this proposal in case this option was to be exercised by the committee. However all of our requests listed in this proposal are needs vs. wants. They all hold a high priority in maintaining and protecting our fire apparatus, facilities and on-site buildings from falling into dis-repair. All share an equal priority from our viewpoint.

10. Describe your plan for project financial sustainability beyond the grant period. If this is a program/project previously funded by the Gila River Indian Community, describe efforts made towards the previously described sustainability plan.

Unincorporated Pinal County residents have relied upon Regional Fire & Rescue Department for their fire protection and Rescue/EMS needs for the past 30 years. RFRD is the primary fire service provider for the unincorporated Pinal County area in the Casa Grande Valley. We are partners in County Wide "all risk" mutual aid and a mutual aid (IGA) partner with the Gila River Fire Department. Despite the occasional City annexation from Eloy, Coolidge or Casa Grande, this facility will always serve as a Fire Station in service to the unincorporated community. Exceptional growth, expansion of Interstate-10 and businesses like LUCID Motors, Kohler, Nikola, Proctor & Gamble as well as other corporations moving to the Casa Grande Valley will increase the demand for homes and residency in the area. We have already seen custom home growth in the immediate area that has not quite yet translated into a dramatic increase in revenue or the number of Subscribers. Our Subscription fee is only voluntary and occasionally insurance companies motivate homeowners when an insurance company finds out their client is not a Subscriber. They are sometimes mandated to subscribe or face the alternative of cancellation of their insurance policy. So we wait patiently for these new homeowners to be motivated to Subscribe in support of their fire protection.

11. Describe your plan to document progress and results.

We will document all expenditures on a Spread Sheet with the items purchased or funds expended following grant award and funds being available over the course of the Grant Award period or to November 2026.



12. Indicate any application to and/or awards made by a tribe other than the Gila River Indian Community for state shared revenues for this and any other project for the past five (5) years.

FY-2019 AK-CHIN – Afforded RFRD the ability to design and build a replacement Fire Apparatus. Receiving a grant from Ak-Chin in the amount of \$160,000.00 we sold a 1996 Freightliner 2000 gallon water truck for \$35,000.00 and added it to the new truck fund. This ultimately provided a total of \$195,000.00 for this new delivery received In January of 2021.

We subsequently "paid it forward" by donating a 1995 Pierce Dash Fire Engine to the Queen Valley Fire District whereby the Ak-Chin grant ultimately benefitted two fire departments in our donation of that fire truck.

September 30, 2025. time. Once all of these priority items have been completed, we will proceed with \$56,290.00 in the category and budget for warranty. Understanding the extent of work required rather than resealing, we have requested a quote from K&M Roofing at this aluminum layer of covering and soft sections of OSB replaced. Then a new cap applied and roof sealed offering a 20 year estimate only covered seal coating and replacement of ceiling tiles for \$7652.00. The updated estimate from Green Comfort are awaiting an estimate from K&M Distributing and Roofing for repair and resealing of the Main Office Roof as our original apparatus maintenance and repairs with a balance of \$16,350.16 available until the end of the performance period of 4" LDH Supply Hoses have not yet been delivered as of this writing. Additionally, \$13,649.84 has been expended for vehicle/fire replacement-refurbished Self-Contained Breathing Apparatus. All items will be completed and all funds exhausted by Remodeling and Repair is \$14,385.10 as they explained the roof must be stripped down to OSB which includes removal of an September 30, 2025. The roof of the FF Living Quarters and Workshop has been re-shingled and repaired costing \$5,165.78. We includes \$21,792.11 paid to United Fire Equipment for replacement Fire Equipment items. Firefighting Boots, 1-3/4" Hoses and expended \$39,814.25 toward grant specific items or categories, leaving an available balance of funds \$118,670.75. This Regional Fire & Rescue Dept., continues to progress toward completion of projects with funding provided. At this time, we have
