FY2019 Action Plan Amendment #2

Purpose of Amendment

Amended on November 18, 2020 to add two additional projects to be completed with CDBG funds.

The rehabilitation and upgrade of the Town of Florence aging water line infrastructure project came in under budget. Resulting in available funds to complete additional projects.

The water line project in Florence was expanded to include an additional neighborhood in a different census tract/block group resulting in the need for an amendment.

Additionally, funds were made available to complete the design and engineering of sewer lines located in the Colonial del Sol neighborhood in an unincorporated part of Pinal County within an additional census tract/block group.

A public notice was placed in area newspapers advertising the public hearing. The public notice was advertised according to the amended citizen participation plan. The public notice was made available in both Spanish and English and posted on the county's website.

On August 26, 2020, the Pinal County Board of Supervisors held a public hearing to receive comments on the proposed use of the available funds equaling \$248,302.76. No public comments were received.

The board unanimously approved the recommendation to proceed with an Amendment to the FY19 Annual Action Plan to include the following projects:

- 1. Expansion of the project and service area of the Town of Florence water line project = \$68,791.76
- Design and Engineering of the Colonial del Sol sewer infrastructure = \$179,511

A second public notice was placed in area newspapers advertising a second public hearing. The public notice was advertised according to the amended citizen participation plan. The public notice was made available in both Spanish and English and posted on the county's website.

Description of the geographic areas of the entitlement (including areas of low-income and minority concentration) where assistance will be directed

The county will focus funding in its initial year on Census Tract 9.01 and 9.02 in Old Town Florence, which has a failing water infrastructure that does not meet standards and poses a fire safety issue. The neighborhood boundaries are roughly to the west of Park, Phoenix, Butte, and 1st Streets. The area is in old Florence, primarily residential but with some businesses and government buildings. The service area boundaries of census tract 9.01 are East 10th Street, North Warner Street, East Butte Avenue, and North Bailey Street. The service area boundaries of census tract 9.02 are West 22nd Street, South Main Street, State Route 287, and the South Bush Street alignment.

A 2017 income survey of 116 households slightly to the east of the target area shows that approximately 32.4% were 1-person households, and 31% were 2 person households. Sixty two percent of those surveyed were of low/moderate income. The neighborhood has not changed since the survey was conducted.

For Florence as a whole, median household income overall is \$47,891, with 16.8% of people living 100% below the poverty level, and 13.8% of children under 12 living in poverty)

For the Census Tract specifically,

- Total median household income of \$39,643
- Black/African American median HH income of \$27,344
- American Indian/Alaska Native median HH income of \$24,028
- 78% Minority population share
- 22.4% population below poverty line
- 5,154 total population
- The HUD Income Limits for 3-person households at 30/50/80% AMI for Phoenix-Scottsdale-Mesa, are \$18,700/\$31,100/\$49,800, respectively.

For its other projects, Pinal County does not use geography as the basis for targeting funds. It is intended that resources will be utilized throughout the County's jurisdiction to benefit low and moderate income people. The County's objective is to be flexible with the use of funding

and other available resources to meet needs countywide

Rationale for the priorities for allocating investments geographically

The county will focus funding in its initial year on specific areas within Census Tract 9.01 and 9.02 in Old Town Florence, which has a failing water infrastructure that does not meet standards and poses a fire safety issue.

For the remainder of its funds, the county has not identified one geographic target area but will disburse the funds throughout the county to support low- and moderate-income citizens.

Due to the reduction in the costs for the Florence waterline project, an additional project was added. The county will design and engineer a sewerline project in Colonial del Sol located in Census Tract 13.01

Discussion

The county will disburse 76% of its first year CDBG funds to Old Town Florence and 24% of the first year CDBG funds throughout the county. The county will disburse 62% of its first year CDBG funds to Old Town Florence, 14% in Colonial del Sol, and 24% of the first year CDBG funds throughout the county.
