We are requesting \$8,060 for equine-assisted therapy scholarships at Manes and Miracles at 43421 N Friend Ave, San Tan Valley, AZ 85140. We believe that this request fits under the Tohono O'odham Nations priority areas of Healthcare and Child Advocacy because we are an equine-assisted therapy facility partnering with five physical therapists and two occupational therapists to serve special needs children in Pinal and Maricopa counties.

Our vision and mission are central to the development of a scholarship fund. Our mission clarifies our dedication to improving the lives of those in Arizona's East Valley who have physical, mental, and emotional disabilities by providing a first-rate therapy facility with unique, effective, and highly motivating tools such as equines and indoor and outdoor play gyms. We aim to affordably enhance the lives of those we serve through the connections they share with our specially trained horses, committed therapist partners, and caring volunteers.

We seek your assistance in the establishment of a scholarship fund in order to ensure that access to life-changing equine-assisted therapy remains available to all, regardless of their financial situation. Manes and Miracles Tohono O'odham Proposal 2022 Consideration






A) Evidence shows the far-reaching physical, mental, emotional, and cognitive benefits of using horses and other unconventional, yet highly effective tools as a part of a therapy program for individuals with disabilities. Unfortunately, the high cost of operating such a vast facility generally makes it out of reach for the children and families who benefit from it most. With your help, we aim to change that!

As a single mother of four disabled children, Kara longed for her children to participate in physical therapy with equines but thought it

was not within her means to afford. That is until she learned about scholarships with Manes and Miracles. She received full scholarships for her children and is amazed at the progress they quickly achieved at the Ranch.

Kara's story is quite common. The burden of medical care expenses that families with special needs children are saddled with is immense. We firmly believe that finances should not play a role in determining the best plan of care for a child. We seek to lift this burden by offering the life-altering healing that comes with equine-assisted therapy at little to no cost.



Each session costs Manes and Miracles \$124. Since our founding in 2018, we have absorbed most of this cost by pulling from our general budget to offer heavily discounted services. Where similar facilities may charge between \$30/session to \$200/session, we proudly ask a mere \$10/session and offer full scholarships to disadvantaged families. However, as we have grown to serve 50-60 children each week, we have seen a sharp rise in the number of clients in need of financial assistance. We have struggled to maintain scholarship expenses from the general

budget while still funding facility and program development and upkeep. Our request for \$8,060 will provide scholarships for up to 70 equine-assisted therapy sessions.



B) Manes and Miracles serves children between 3 and 21 years old with developmental disabilities in Pinal and Maricopa counties. There are actively 59 children receiving deeply impactful services with us. This number is ever-growing as we regularly have around 20 children on our waitlist. Additionally, over 350 volunteer hours are logged each week, many from individuals with disabilities themselves such as autism and PTSD. Individuals seeking to benefit from this proposal will apply for assistance based on their financial need and the

recommendation of their supervising therapist ensuring that the funds are honored as disclosed in this application. Manes and Miracles does not discriminate nor require the disclosure of race or heritage.

C) Manes and Miracles is requesting \$8,060 from the Tohono O'odham Nation's 12% Gaming Distribution to be used for equine-assisted therapy scholarships.

 - Thunderbirds Charities, \$20,000 grant. Application pending approval
 - Private donor, \$15,000 donation. Recurring donor not yet guaranteed for 2022-2023 season.
- **E)** We have not previously received a grant as part of the 12% distribution from the Tohono O'odham Nation or other Arizona tribes.
